1 [20] And behold, a woman who had **suffer**ed from a hemorrhage for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his garment;

<u>Matt.11</u>

[12] From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and men of violence take it by force.

<u>Matt.16</u>

1 [21] From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised.

<u>Matt.17</u>

- 1 [12] but I tell you that Eli'jah has already come, and they did not know him, but did to him whatever they pleased. So also the Son of man will **suffer** at their hands."

1 [2] And he answered them, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they **suffer**ed thus?

- 2 [46] and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should **suffer** and on the third day rise from the dead,

Acts.3

1 [18] But what God foretold by the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ should suffer, he thus fulfilled.

Acts.5

1 [41] Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name.

<u>Acts.9</u> 1

[16] for I will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name."

<u>Acts.17</u> 1

[3] explaining and proving that it was necessary for the Christ to **suffer** and to rise from the dead, and saying, "This Jesus, whom I proclaim to you, is the Christ."

<u>Acts.26</u>

1 [23] that the Christ must **suffer**, and that, by being the first to rise from the dead, he would proclaim light both to the people and to the Gentiles."

<u>Acts.28</u>

1 [5] He, however, shook off the creature into the fire and suffered no harm.

<u>Rom.5</u>

1 [3] More than that, we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance,

<u>Rom.8</u>

- 1 [17] and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.
- 2 [18] I consider that the **suffer**ings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us.

1Cor.3

1 [15] If any man's work is burned up, he will **suffer** loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire.

<u>1Cor.6</u>

1 [7] To have lawsuits at all with one another is defeat for you. Why not rather **suffer** wrong? Why not rather be defrauded?

1Cor.12

1 [26] If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together.

<u>2Cor.1</u>

- 1 [5] For as we share abundantly in Christ's **suffer**ings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too.
- 2 [6] If we are afflicted, it is for your comfort and salvation; and if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which you experience when you patiently endure the same **suffer**ings that we **suffer**.
- 3 [7] Our hope for you is unshaken; for we know that as you share in our **suffer**ings, you will also share in our comfort.

<u>2Cor.2</u>

1 [3] And I wrote as I did, so that when I came I might not **suffer** pain from those who should have made me rejoice, for I felt sure of all of you, that my joy would be the joy of you all.

<u>2Cor.7</u>

- 1 [9] As it is, I rejoice, not because you were grieved, but because you were grieved into repenting; for you felt a godly grief, so that you **suffer**ed no loss through us.
- 2 [12] So although I wrote to you, it was not on account of the one who did the wrong, nor on account of the one who **suffered** the wrong, but in order that your zeal for us might be revealed to you in the sight of God.

<u>Eph.3</u>

1 [13] So I ask you not to lose heart over what I am **suffer**ing for you, which is your glory.

<u>Phil.1</u>

1 [29] For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also **suffer** for his sake,

<u>Phil.3</u>

- 1 [8] Indeed I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have **suffered** the loss of all things, and count them as refuse, in order that I may gain Christ
- 2 [10] that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his **suffer**ings, becoming like him in his death,

<u>Col.1</u>

1 [24] Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church,

1Thes.2

- 1 [2] but though we had already **suffered** and been shamefully treated at Philip'pi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in the face of great opposition.
- 2 [14] For you, brethren, became imitators of the churches of God in Christ Jesus which are in Judea; for you **suffered** the same things from your own countrymen as they did from the Jews,

1Thes.3

1 [4] For when we were with you, we told you beforehand that we were to **suffer** affliction; just as it has come to pass, and as you know.

<u>2Thes.1</u>

- 1 [5] This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, that you may be made worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are **suffer**ing --
- 2 [9] They shall **suffer** the punishment of eternal destruction and exclusion from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might,

<u>2Tim.1</u>

- 1 [8] Do not be ashamed then of testifying to our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in **suffer**ing for the gospel in the power of God,
- 2 [12] and therefore I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that Day what has been entrusted to me.

<u>2Tim.2</u>

- 1 [3] Share in **suffer**ing as a good soldier of Christ Jesus.
- 2 [9] the gospel for which I am **suffer**ing and wearing fetters like a criminal. But the word of God is not fettered.

<u>2Tim.3</u>

1 [11] my persecutions, my sufferings, what befell me at Antioch, at Ico'nium, and at Lystra, what persecutions I endured; yet from them all the Lord rescued me.

2Tim.4

[5] As for you, always be steady, endure **suffer**ing, do the work of an evangelist, fulfil your ministry.

Heb.2

- 1 [9] But we see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, crowned with glory and honor because of the **suffer**ing of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for every one.
- 2 [10] For it was fitting that he, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through **suffer**ing.

3 [18] For because he himself has **suffered** and been tempted, he is able to help those who are tempted.

Heb.5

1 [8] Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered;

Heb.9

1 [26] for then he would have had to **suffer** repeatedly since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.

<u>Heb.10</u>

1 [32] But recall the former days when, after you were enlightened, you endured a hard struggle with **suffer**ings,

<u>Heb.11</u>

- 1 [26] He considered abuse suffered for the Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he looked to the reward.
- 2 [36] Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment.

<u>Heb.13</u>

- 1 [12] So Jesus also **suffer**ed outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. Jas.5
 - 1 [10] As an example of **suffer**ing and patience, brethren, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.
 - 2 [13] Is any one among you suffering? Let him pray. Is any cheerful? Let him sing praise.

<u>1Pet.1</u>

- 1 [6] In this you rejoice, though now for a little while you may have to **suffer** various trials,
- 2 [11] they inquired what person or time was indicated by the Spirit of Christ within them when predicting the **suffer**ings of Christ and the subsequent glory.

1Pet.2

- 1 [19] For one is approved if, mindful of God, he endures pain while suffering unjustly.
- 2 [20] For what credit is it, if when you do wrong and are beaten for it you take it patiently? But if when you do right and **suffer** for it you take it patiently, you have God's approval.
- 3 [21] For to this you have been called, because Christ also **suffered** for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps.
- 4 [23] When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he **suffered**, he did not threaten; but he trusted to him who judges justly.

1Pet.3

- 1 [14] But even if you do **suffer** for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled,
- 2 [17] For it is better to suffer for doing right, if that should be God's will, than for doing wrong.

<u>1Pet.4</u>

- 1 [1] Since therefore Christ **suffer**ed in the flesh, arm yourselves with the same thought, for whoever has **suffer**ed in the flesh has ceased from sin,
- 2 [13] But rejoice in so far as you share Christ's **suffer**ings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed.
- 3 [15] But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or a thief, or a wrongdoer, or a mischief-maker;
- 4 [16] yet if one **suffers** as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but under that name let him glorify God.
- 5 [19] Therefore let those who **suffer** according to God's will do right and entrust their souls to a faithful Creator.

<u>1Pet.5</u>

- 1 [1] So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the **suffer**ings of Christ as well as a partaker in the glory that is to be revealed.
- 2 [9] Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same experience of **suffer**ing is required of your brotherhood throughout the world.
- 3 [10] And after you have **suffer**ed a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, establish, and strengthen you.

2Pet.2

1 [13] suffering wrong for their wrongdoing. They count it pleasure to revel in the daytime. They are blots and blemishes, reveling in their dissipation, carousing with you.

<u>Rev.2</u>

1 [10] Do not fear what you are about to **suffer**. Behold, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested, and for ten days you will have tribulation. Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life.
